

The Devil's Porridge was the explosive paste which these workers fashioned into ammunition at HM Factory Gretna for British troops and helped to turn the course of history. ... And it happened here!

What is the Devil's Forridge?

When Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, creator of Sherlock Holmes, visited HM Factory Gretna in 1916, he described the explosive paste which was mixed by hand as the Devil's Porridge.

It is a very apt name for the highly explosive mixture of nitro-glycerine and nitro-cotton. The dried paste was shaped into cordite which was put into shells and bullets. This Scottish Factory produced more cordite than all the other factories in Britain put together.



The Secret Cities of the War

The two new townships of Eastriggs and Gretna were created during World War 1 to house many of the 30,000 workers who worked in the factory...but the new communities did not officially exist because of the secrecy of the operation. They were referred to by their codename "Moorside."

Conan Doyle described these townships as the Miracle Towns, because the houses were not just thrown up without thought. They were designed by prominent architects of the day to modern Garden City Principles and provided for all the needs of the munitions workers.

The Greatest Factory on Earth



HM Factory Gretna was one of the largest factories ever built. Its buildings stretched over nine miles from the outskirts of Annan across the border to Longtown.

Among the many statistics are: the factory had

- its own railway network had 125 miles of track, with 34 railway engines.
- its own large power station provided electricity for the factory and the townships
- it had its own water treatment plant handling ten million gallons daily
- its telephone exchange handled 2.5 million calls in 1918
- the factory bakeries produced 14,000 meals and 13,000 loaves daily
- the laundry could clean 6,000 items daily

The Solway factory produced more than all the other plants in Britain put together.
